The Auxiliary will be in charge of this dinner, not sure what we will be serving. but will be good.



Greetings from your Aerie Secretary:

First on the agenda is the reminder that your Aerie dues are due by the end of August if you have not already paid up for next year. For those who have already paid up, thank you in advance. I will be mailing out the new cards very soon.

For all of those who attended the Aerie picnic on Saturday, August 23rd, thank you for making the event such an absolute success. What a great time we had and raised a considerable amount of money for the Veterans' Food Bank. A special thank you needs to go out to the Battello family for all their hard work and their dedication to the cause. It indeed was a family involvement as the kids took a special interest in being involved and their contributions were greatly appreciated. Here is the break down of the events held and the money raised for the Veterans' Food Bank:

DUNK TANK: We rented a dunk tank from the Celebrate Party Store and some of the Aerie Officers volunteered to be targets for anyone who was willing to step up to pay five dollars for three chances to see that officer take a dive. Let me tell you the water was straight out of the tap with some ice added for flavor. Our total income from that event amounted to \$295.00. Joseph Battello volunteered and earned \$10.00 for the cause. Domonic Battello earned \$20.00. Craig Christopherson earned \$40.00. Les Price earned \$60.00.

Garrad and Willie (two others who donated to the cause) together earned \$75.00. And our grand award winner goes out to our Worthy President, Tony Battello who earned a grand total of \$90.00. Some of his co-workers from Plum Creek made sure to event stayed alive. Thank you all for your participation for such a good cause.

DART TOSS. Many of the vendors and suppliers donated a variety of items to our event which we used as prizes along with tickets for an opportunity to win a booze basket provided by the Aerie. For five dollars you had three chances to pop a balloon which contained either a numbered prize or a ticket to the booze basket drawing. This event generated the largest

participation earning a grand total of \$355.00 for the Veterans' Food Bank Charity. In addition to the ticket prizes for the booze basket, participants purchased another \$135.00 worth of chances. DONATIONS: We received an anonymous donation of \$100.00 from one of our members who wished not to be recognized. Our veterans are important to them and we appreciate the opportunity to give back to the community any way we can. On behalf of the Aerie membership, I say thank you very much for your donation. It is greatly appreciated and will be put to good use for a good cause.

Our picnic was a real hoot and everyone who attended knows the food was out of this world. Smoked and barbequed ribs were served with corn on the cob and fry bread. Many of the campers who came up on the Friday before the picnic and many who came on Saturday brought main dishes, side dishes of salads and desserts. Some barbequed chicken was prepared for those folks who could not eat the ribs. In addition, breakfast was prepared for anyone who attended consisting of hot cakes, hash browns, sausage links and patties, bacon, eggs the way you like um and Tony's famous Denver scramble. Coffee was always on and a warm fire to warm your aching bones was attended to by the Battello boys. Some folks went fishing, some folks played horse shoes, and some played the ring toss or holy broad game on the grass. The rest of us just sat around by the fire and socialized as the day wore on.
